



Trails are Important!

Foote Pond Old Orchard Park Whirlpool River Access



Cost Estimate losco County Non-motorized path

AuSable River to Oscoda High School	\$1,350,000
Oscoda High School to Old Orchard Park	\$1,370,000
Old Orchard Park to Lumberman's Monument	\$1,600,000
Lumberman's Monument to M-65	\$830,000
M-65 to Britt Road	\$900,000
Britt Road to Hale	\$2,460,000
TOTAL ESTIMATED COST - 34 MILES	\$8,510,000
