

# COMMUNITY DESCRIPTION



City of Harrisville Recreation Plan

#### **Extent of Plan Focus**

This Recreation Plan addresses recreational facilities and opportunities within the boundaries of the City of Harrisville. The Plan evaluates the

community characteristics and recreational opportunities to assist in future recreation-related planning decisions.

## **Regional Location**


The City of Harrisville covers 0.6 square miles in the northeastern section of Michigan's Lower Peninsula. The City is bordered by Lake Huron to the east, and Harrisville Township to the north, south, and west (**Figure 1-1**). The latitude of the City is approximately halfway between the North Pole and the equator and is also located along the Mississippi Flyway, a bird migration route. Mill Creek flows through the northern part of the city and empties into Lake Huron near Harrisville Harbor.


## **Population, Housing, & Transportation**

According to the 2021 American Community Survey, the City of Harrisville has a population of 473 people compared to Alcona County's population of 10,138 people. There are 319 total housing units with 222 classified as occupied and 97 classified as vacant. Out of the vacant units, 44 are classified as seasonal, recreational, or occasional use. Based on the city's average household size of 1.98, the estimated seasonal population would be approximately 88 persons. However, this estimate does not include persons who stay at private lodging places, campgrounds, or at homes with family or friends, which makes it difficult to obtain a seasonal population estimate.

Many residents and visitors travel along U.S. 23, M-72, and Main Street. The U.S. 23 and M-72 intersection is the only signalized intersection in U.S. 23 travels along Lake Alcona County. Huron's shoreline to connect the city with Alpena to the north and Oscoda to the south. M-72 travels east-west across the State of Michigan to connect the city with Mio, Grayling, Kalkaska, and Traverse City. The Thunder Bay Transportation Authority provides an on-demand public transportation service within Alcona, Alpena, and Montmorency Counties. In addition, the City of Harrisville owns and operates the only public airport serving Alcona County, which can accommodate small aircraft.

# ADMINISTRATIVE **STRUCTURE**

#### **Administration**

The City of Harrisville is governed by an elected nine-member city council consisting of a mayor, clerk, treasurer, and two council members from each of the City's three wards (**Figure 2-1**). The council employs a part-time zoning administrator, a contractual assessor, and three maintenance department employees (one part-time, two full-time). The maintenance department is responsible for snow removal, street maintenance, operation of the city's water and

sewer system, and maintaining the city-owned properties except the harbor and its docks. The city has the following committees: the Beautification Committee, the Tree Board, and the Memorial Committee.

The Planning Commission and Harbor Commission are primarily responsible for the planning and operation of the recreational facilities in the City of Harrisville.

#### **Planning Commission**

The Planning Commission consists of nine members and is responsible for all aspects of planning in the city, including the development of a comprehensive plan, reviewing site plans, and providing recommendations to the City Council on zoning-related amendments and requests.

In 1985, the City passed a resolution for the Planning Commission to assume the functions of a Parks and Recreation Commission, including the development of a recreation plan, overseeing the operation of city owned and/or maintained recreational facilities, and other duties as assigned by the City Council.

#### **Harrisville Harbor Commission**

The Harrisville Harbor Commission is an agency of the City of Harrisville that was created by the City Council to operate and manage the harbor of refuge, its grounds, appurtenances, and improvements bordering Lake Huron per the City Ordinance(s) and State and Federal laws. Its mission is to provide a safe, efficient, comprehensive, and enjoyable harbor experience for the City of Harrisville, its neighbors, and its visitors.


The business and affairs of the harbor commission are managed by its Board of Commissioners, who set and maintain the annual budget. Commissioners are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the City Ordinances, Commission Bylaws, policies and procedures, operations, and budget. The Commission has updated the Harbor Bylaws and created online and electronic communications standards, and is in the process of updating the Management and Procedures policy. Job descriptions, and evaluation and acceptance processes are created

as needed. Vacancies are posted on websites, but recruitment is primarily through word of mouth and referrals. The harbor is challenged by a shortage of skilled staff due to a lack of interest and candidates declining positions. challenge has created scheduling issues and contractual personnel have been utilized to fill vacancies. Harbor staff includes a seasonal harbormaster. а part-time recording secretary/bookkeeper (contractual position), a seasonal assistant harbormaster/lead dockhand, an information technology position, and summer seasonal dockhands as needed.

The harbormaster is responsible for operations and maintenance of the harbor including managing the maintenance schedule, equipment inventory list, and records of staff training, licenses, and certificates. Staff training and licenses are obtained as needed. The Information Technology staff member and harbor vendors are responsible for the online and communications activities and training plan.

## **Other Agencies & Civic Organizations**

#### **US 23 Heritage Route - Alcona Heritage Route Team**

Each county along the US 23 Heritage Route has a team of volunteers who participate on the US 23 Management Council to coordinate efforts along the route and works with the Northeast Michigan Council of Governments (NEMCOG) to implement projects. The team established a historic walking trail through the city and with technical assistance from NEMCOG and a grant from the Community Foundation of Northeast Michigan, the team was

able to develop signage and a brochure for the trail. Additionally, the team has developed brochures and a tourism website (https://www.us23heritageroute.org/) to promote the recreational facilities and activities in the county and along the US 23 Heritage Route. Currently, the group is interested in developing a countywide trail system along U.S. 23 that will connect to the city trail.

#### **Sunrise Garden Club**

The Sunrise Garden Club contributes to the beautification of the city's facilities and has worked with the Alcona Heritage Route Team to beautify the trailhead at the corner of Harbor Drive and Lake Street. The garden club holds garden walk events to display the gardens throughout the

community, and proceeds have gone to the Friends of Negwegon State Park for park improvements, the Harrisville Library for garden maintenance, Alcona County Extension office for landscaping, and to the Harrisville Harbor trailhead garden and beautification projects.

#### **Harrisville Depot Committee**

The Harrisville Depot Committee is in the early stages of stabilization and restoration of the Harrisville Train Depot. The Harrisville Depot Committee meetings are held at 10 am on the

third Wednesday of the month at the Harrisville Harbor, when it is open, and at the Alcona County Library during the winter months.

#### **Harrisville Arts Council**

The Harrisville Arts Council coordinates over 500 exhibitors around the Craftmaker's Cabin and the area near the tennis courts on U.S. 23 during the Labor Day Art Fair.

#### **East Shore Art Guild**

The East Shore Art Guild operates a gallery in downtown Harrisville and sponsors an art show at the harbor.

#### **Lions Club**

The Harrisville Lions Club sponsors recreational events in Harrisville, such as the Duck Race on July 4th.

## **Parks & Recreation Funding**

The majority of the City's parks and recreation budget comes from the general fund. The 2023-2024 parks & recreation budget is ~\$97,910, which includes capital outlay, salaries, utilities, beautification, supplies/uniforms, professional services, refuse, equipment, ballpark expenses, repairs/maintenance, pocket park, mill pond light, etc. In addition, the City of Harrisville has a line item for maintenance and supplies for Harbor Park, which is ~\$13,120 in the 2023-2024 budget. The projected 2024-2025 budget is expected to be similar to the 2023-2024 budget.

The Commission's Harbor Board οf Commissioners review and control the harbor's budget. Generally, the harbor operates on a break even status and funds for 2024-2029 projects will need to be developed and evaluated within the budget. In 2023, net dockage after fees and credit card costs was \$97,336 (not including fixed costs and labor), and seasonal sales of gasoline and diesel fuel was \$219,854 (45,212 gallons). In 2023, year-end price wars among marinas ended the harbor's sales since other marinas were selling fuel at near cost. Margins on sales have traditionally been calculated to be competitive with nearby marinas. Other sales and services have been largely limited to pump outs and laundry machines. The harbor has upgraded and linked its finance and budget processes to the Point-of-Sale system. In addition, the harbor computer, camera system, and networks were replaced, and leases and maintenance of these items are now part of the monthly fixed cost of the harbor.

Annually, it is estimated about \$6,970 will be spent on software, and about \$4,000 will be spent on office and building equipment. In 2023, the harbor paid dock hands between \$12-\$15 to remain competitive. Dockage fees were increased for 2024 by 15%, which is equal to the cumulative inflation rate of 15%. This increase is the first since 2019.

Current plans address harbor maintenance, but major harbor improvements need funding. Major projects include carpet for the marina building (awaiting bids), replacing the outside stairs from the upper parking lot since they are not in a favorable condition or ADA compliant, dredging, and refinishing decking (two piers sustained severe ice damage two years ago that has rendered them unusable and has reduced the harbor's capacity).

Current budget impacts include cost increases due to inflation (current national trends are at 6% inflation), costs related to an increased use of

credit cards (card fees are approximately 3%), an increase in the Marine Diesel Tax, staff and commissioner costs, and increasing costs for fuel, supplies, maintenance, and equipment replacement. As of 2023, revenue and employee costs (e.g. mandatory wage increases and benefits) have limited the harbor's ability to employ full time position staffing. The harbor did not receive COVID relief funds and the post-COVID economics as well as increased expenses have restricted activity in the marina community.

From 2016-2020, the City of Harrisville was in a five year grant process with the State of Michigan

Waterways Commission to replace all of the docks at the Harrisville Harbor for a total project cost of \$2,787,200 under five separate contracts (the project was budgeted over five separate grant rounds). The docks were re-built in five phases beginning in 2018 with some carry over into 2021. Repairs and widening of two docks, removal of old pilings, and dredging were not completed due to the State rescinding the grant monies to be used for COVID relief funding and not reinstating the grant monies towards the final phase of the project. In 2022 and 2023, summer storms caused some damage to the docks.

## **Recreation Grant History**

The City of Harrisville received and successfully completed two grants and acquired one grant through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources recreation grants program.

- 1. Harrisville Park Development, 1985, Grant # 26-01346: Developed a playground, picnic areas, paved parking, pavilion, LWCF sign, and buried overhead wires.
- 2. Harrisville Harbor Park Playground Development, 2018, Grant # RP18-0116: Developed a playground at Harbor Park to include an access pathway 6' wide or more, benches, picnic tables, play equipment, and playground safety surfacing.
- 3. Harrisville Recreation Area, 1989, Grant # BF89-530: This grant was originally received by Alcona County for park development. In the mid-1990's, it was transferred to Harrisville Township and became known as the Harrisville Township Recreation Area. Recently, the property has been transferred to the City of Harrisville. The grant funded the renovation of two existing baseball diamonds.

#### **Inventory Method & Classification System**

Staff from the Northeast Michigan Council of Governments (NEMCOG) visited each recreation facility to do an on-site assessment in order to update the park's information, accessibility rating, and photos from previous years. In addition, information from previous strategic plans and city officials was used to update the plan.

An evaluation of each park's accessibility was completed during the on-site inventory. This assessment visually evaluated the accessibility of facilities and routes to facilities for persons with

mobility constraints. Barrier-free accessibility in parks and recreational facilities is important for current and future programming as it makes these spaces more inclusive and easier for all to use. The assessment followed the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' scale for evaluating park accessibility in the 2021 Guidelines for the Development of Community Park, Recreation, Open Space, and Greenways Plans on a scale of 1 to 5.

In the 1960's, the harbor was established as a Harbor of Refuge and has served as an important refuge between Alpena and Oscoda. Harrisville Harbor accesses Lake Huron and is part of the State of Michigan's Harbor of Refuge network. The Harrisville Harbor Commission operates, manages, and maintains the Harrisville Harbor, grounds, building and equipment. Lawns are continuously maintained, and animal and plant control is contracted on an as needed basis. Land improvements have not been scheduled and erosion control measures are needed on the beach and at the steps from the upper parking lot. In 2023, the cash and point-of-sale systems, calendars, and websites were updated. The State of Michigan holds ownership of the water and lake bottom surrounding the harbor, while the City of Harrisville owns the docks within the harbor, and maintains and dredges the water around the The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers constructed and owns two break walls surrounding the harbor. Breakwater repairs were completed by the Army Corps of Engineers in 2022, but further repairs are needed.

The harbor is open to the public between April 15<sup>th</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup> from 6 am to 8 pm. After October 15<sup>th</sup>, the public restrooms, docks, and fuel facilities are winterized and limited building use occurs. In 2007, the harbor was completely reconstructed and is acclaimed by boaters to be the nicest harbor on the Lake Huron shore. A bubbler system was installed for the docks and is part of the provision of overwintered dockage of the commercial tenants. The harbor offers 74 docks for transient (including two damaged docks





in need of widening and repair), seasonal, and commercial rental. Approximately 50% of the harbor is provisioned for transient dockage. The harbor also provides dockage for area, state, and federal agencies, and year round dockage for two commercial tenants. In 2015, Edgewater Resources, LLC conducted a preliminary engineering study and recommended the harbor have 70 traditional slips and 8 broadside dockage spaces to meet customer demand. Based on the 2015 report, the harbor is too small and does not meet boater demand. Currently, there is a waitlist for seasonal slip rentals and is awaiting seasonal contract commitments for verification.

The harbor has vacancies every night of the season except for July 4th and one week following the MAC Races. During 2023, there were 35 seasonal docks rented, two commercial boats, 671 transient slip night rentals, and 10 boats were placed on a waiting list. It is estimated about 50 units are occupied by vessels that arrive late and leave early without paying. In 2022 and 2023, the State's reservation system was not functioning properly, and boaters were told the harbor was full when it was not. Lost dockage was estimated at 15% in 2023. In 2024, the harbor will use a new system and website for reservations. Another major loss in dockage was due to the closure of the Chicago River Canal for repairs until 2024, which blocked the LOOP boaters

The harbor provides services as required for the Water Ways Commission and DNR harbors. Facilities include a fuel station (gasoline and diesel), pump-out service, slip rentals, 30 and 50 amp electrical service, potable water, public restrooms/showers, minimal boating supplies, laundry service, wireless internet, ice, boat launch, benches, trash receptacles, a coinoperated viewing device for Lake Huron, and a courtesy van to visit the nearby restaurants, stores, and historic attractions. The harbor replaced the transport van and harbor pontoon maintenance platform.

The Bikes for Boaters Sponsorship program is scheduled to end at the end of the 2024 season. The program provided funding from local businesses and organizations for four adult trikes and four to six adult bicycles with baskets in an effort to provide transportation to local businesses. Sponsors provided funding for a three-year sponsorship and were allowed to attach one piece of advertising on the basket placard. The harbor stores and maintains the bikes.

A fishing program was developed to permit safe fishing in the harbor to protect the docks and avoid interfering with boaters. This program has been coordinated with other basin authorities.



The community donated three small sailboats, and a request has been submitted for five or more boats of a specific design (sunfish/sailfish/dolphin senior) to be utilized in youth and adult sailing and water safety programs. A similar program is not available in at least a 45 mile radius.

Harrisville Harbor was on a 10 year dredging cycle schedule. However, the dredging schedule will soon be four years overdue, which is concerning due to the dropping lake levels. The Army Corps of Engineers has provided five aerial photos highlighting areas in need of dredging, but have not provided project expenses. In 2014, the entrance channel and ramps fairway were dredged under the State of Michigan emergency dredging program at a cost of \$230,692. A total of 6,330 cubic yards of material was removed and transferred from a barge directly into trucks located south of the north breakwater before being hauled away to a 25-acre city-owned property several miles north and west of the harbor. In 2015, the City of Harrisville removed 9,950 cubic yards of material from around the docks at an equivalent value of \$429,100. The city built a temporary confinement area in the same transfer area used by the State. Dredged material settled in this location over the Summer and Fall of 2015, and was removed to the same disposal area used by the State.

For marketing purposes, the Harrisville Harbor maintains a website: https://harrisvilleharbor.com and receives visitors from the Michigan DNR and Pure Michigan websites. The harbor's event calendars and websites are periodically updated with public notices, event advertisements, and fuel prices. In addition, harbor activities are

promoted by the Alcona County Chamber of Commerce and by the US 23 Heritage Route partnership – a six county collaborative effort to market the Lake Huron coastal area known as the Sunrise Coast. A recent effort has been proposed to engage in a collaborative marketing effort with marinas in Alpena and Rogers City. Possible harbor marketing tools include brochures, giveaways, travel shows, videos, and billboards. The harbor partners with the Michigan DNR, the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary, the City of Alpena Marina, and the Rogers City Marina.

Harrisville Harbor encompasses Harbor Park. The park offers volleyball courts, horseshoe pits, a pavilion, grills, picnic tables, trash receptacles, benches, a playground, and a dog run area. The playground features benches, bike racks, a water fountain, three play structures, a tire swing, a

swing set, and a tire in the ground. The harbor's restrooms are available to the public when the harbor is open. The restrooms are maintained by harbor staff and current charges for events at the gazebo or in the city park do not cover the cost of staff and restroom maintenance.

There are three parking lots with one lot providing 37 spaces next to the marina office that is prioritized for marina tenants. A clean harbor project built a runoff control plot at the base of the marina office lot. The second lot provides 36 spaces and a viewing area, and the third lot provides 30 spaces next to Lake Street. The upper parking lot is utilized for long-term boat trailer parking as well as city events. The steps from the upper parking lot are not ADA compliant, but have been 'grandfathered' by the City of Harrisville, which is seeking repair solutions.

The Veteran's Club Property is the site of the former Harrisville Fish Hatchery. The State of Michigan owns the building and property. The building houses the Health Department, and the

city leases the property. There is a pond, which is a favorite fishing site for children. The site has basketball courts and, in the winter, there is a lighted ice rink with temporary benches.

The trail connects Harrisville Harbor to Harrisville State Park and Harrisville Township Park. Brochures provide information about historic structures along the route, such as the Harrisville Depot, Craftmakers' Cabin, and former Harbor Master's House.

## **Description**

The Harrisville Recreation Area was originally owned by Alcona County and was given to Harrisville Township in 1994. Recently, Harrisville Township gave the property to the City of Harrisville. The site includes one softball diamond, two baseball diamonds, bleachers,

dugouts, restrooms, a pavilion, a picnic area, and a playground with a sandbox and jungle gym. The site is also home to the Harrisville Community Hoop House, which is sponsored by the Alcona Local Foods Association.

## **Other Publicly-Owned Recreational Facilities**

#### **Harrisville Michigan DNR Boating Access Site**

#### **Description**

The boating access site consists of 130 parking spaces, a public restroom, and the ramp is wide enough to accommodate two skid piers. The site

is available for day use only and does not have overnight camping. A recreation passport is required to use the site.

## **Alcona County Quilt Trail**

## **Description**

The Alcona County Quilt Trail is Michigan's first quilt trail and includes a self-guided walking and driving tour throughout the county. The trail has stops at merchants in downtown Harrisville. The map highlights the locations of quilt squares and has historic descriptions of each site.

## **Other Privately-Owned Recreational Facilities**

#### Campdoyawanna Campground & Party Store LLC

## **Description**

The campground offers electricity, water, a dump station, and wireless internet. There is a playground, a volleyball/badminton court,

horseshoes, a fish cleaning station, and bike rentals. The campground also has daily and seasonal events.

## **Harrisville Train Depot**

## **Description**

The Harrisville Train Depot is one of few remaining in the Northern Lower Peninsula of Michigan. The 1,200 square foot Depot is located at 301 Dock Street in Harrisville, Michigan. It sits on approximately 1.4 acres of land near the Lake Huron shore and a few blocks from Main Street, MacGregor Park, and Harrisville Harbor. The Depot was constructed of cut limestone in 1901, making it a meritorious and rare architectural style of Richardsonian Romanesque. The Depot was open for passenger service from 1901 to 1951. The Detroit and Mackinac Railway Company then used the building for mail and freight storage for a few years. The depot has been shuttered and abandoned over half its life, while repeatedly being subjected to vandalism, abuse, and neglect. In January 2023, Lake State Railway Company deeded the historic Harrisville Train Depot and surrounding property to the Alcona Historical Society, a local 501c3. Deed restrictions state the property must always be held by either a 501c3 or local municipality. The depot is a community asset and is not to be privately owned.

The Harrisville Depot Committee was created to spearhead the stabilization, restoration, and adaptive reuse effort of the depot. The committee envisions cultivating the depot into a community center and event venue with the possibility of an Artist in Residence program. Committee members participate in local events, parades, and Farmers Markets to share information and build

enthusiasm for the depot's future restoration. Currently, the committee is exploring registration of the Depot on the Michigan State Historic Sites and the National Register of Historic Places. Projects to date include the activation of consumers electrical, installation of security cameras and internet, roof repairs, window and door repair and replacement, and sign repair.

Marketing and funding endeavors include a Facebook group, Page, Go Fund Me Account, and multiple fundraising events, such as the Depot Community Garage Sale and the Pig Roast Dinner Dance, Raffle, and Silent Auction, and Santa Visit & Quilt Raffle. Information about the Depot can be found at https://www.harrisvilledepot.com.

#### **Other Recreation Facilities**

Residents can utilize recreational facilities outside of the City of Harrisville. Listed below are the public and private recreational facilities in Alcona County. Complete information about the recreational facilities can be found in the appropriate recreation plans.

In addition, city residents have access to recreational opportunities in Alpena, 32 miles to the north, and Oscoda, 16 miles south. However, many of these opportunities require fees and all require travel to access them. The City of Alpena offers 22 recreational properties, including an

indoor community pool, an ice rink for hockey and pleasure skating, and many community parks with swimming and fishing access. Oscoda has a waterfront park on Lake Huron with a playground and tennis courts, and the Oscoda High School has an indoor swimming pool, which is open to the public on a limited basis. Picnicking and boating are also available at Van Etten Lake in Oscoda. A lake-side park located north of Oscoda on U.S. 23, offers picnicking and swimming. Finally, several campgrounds are located in or near the Huron National Forest.



Alderman Schwanz reports that the Christmas decorations are shedding and asked if it would be possible for people to purchase new decorations as honorariums; and also states that the main camera at the Harbor is not working. #### **Goals & Objectives**

After reviewing input from the community and the city's demographic characteristics, the Planning Commission developed the following goals,

objectives, and action items to provide guidance during the development of recreation-related projects.

#### Goal 1 Create a recreational system that is visible, promoted, and easily accessible to all users.

- Objective 1 Improve universal accessibility across all parks in the city.
- Objective 2 Use signage and maps to connect the local trail system with established trail systems and points of interest.
- Objective 3 Provide year-round recreational amenities which are oriented towards the aging population, the younger population, and families in an effort to increase the desirability and livability of the community to attract retirees, young families, and older youth.
- Objective 4 Market the city's recreational programming and amenities.

### Goal 2 Actively improve and maintain recreational resources in the City of Harrisville and on Lake Huron.

- Objective 1 Adopt a capital facilities program to prioritize and identify funding for improving and expanding existing amenities that would serve the city's population and to support the ongoing activities at those facilities.
- Objective 2 Prepare and implement a regular maintenance plan to keep the city's parks in good condition.
- Objective 3 Repair and replace worn out and damaged equipment.
- Objective 4 Improve and expand the restrooms, internet service, and cell phone service at all parks in the city.

#### Goal 3 Ensure a thorough and regional Recreational Planning Process.

- Objective 1 Regularly update the 5-year Parks and Recreation Plan to ensure the recreation system reflects the current needs of the community.
- Objective 2 Develop and maintain strong city involvement when creating recreational and tourism planning and projects for people of all abilities and recreational needs.
- Objective 3 Seek grant funding and other financial assistance to assist in creating recreation-related jobs, and acquiring and developing recreational facilities.
- Objective 4 Support cooperative regional recreation planning and development with Alcona County, local and state governmental agencies, community service agencies, and local businesses/entrepreneurs.
- Objective 5 Improve the quality of life for residents and attract visitors to the city by maintaining, improving, and expanding recreation within the city and surrounding areas.

### Goal 4 Provide new opportunities for passive recreation to allow residents and visitors to enjoy the natural beauty of the city.

Objective 1 Promote the use, development, and expansion of non-motorized trails in the city's preserved natural spaces.

Objective 2 Acquire and develop natural areas to provide ecotourism opportunities, such as nature trails, sitting areas, nature centers, etc.

#### **Action Plan**

The Action Plan provides proposed improvements to each site with anticipated cost estimates, funding sources, completion years, and priorities. It should be noted these anticipated items may change due to unforeseen circumstances, such as changes in market conditions, unavailable funding, changes in priorities, etc.

#### **Basis for Action**

- 1. The City of Harrisville has a significantly older population with individuals aged 60 years and older comprising about 43.6% of the population compared to the State of Michigan at 24.2%. The majority of migration into the city is from persons aged 60 years and older. Therefore, this large population has the time and desire to participate in age appropriate recreational activities that are easily accessible. In addition, approximately 15.0% of the city's population is under the age of 19 and has very little access to recreational opportunities in the city. This younger population also needs transportation to the recreation-related amenities at the school facilities, which are located six miles west of the city. Finally, individuals in the city between the ages of 20 to 44 years represent 26.6% of the population and should be given consideration during the planning process.
- 2. The City's median household income is \$33,500 compared to the State's median income of \$63,202. About 61.7% of the households in the city receive social security income compared to 34.6% statewide. Additionally, almost 62% of the households receive retirement income compared to 38.5% statewide. Consideration should be given to whether or not residents and visitors are able to afford the cost of recreational activities and the drive time and expenses associated with travelling to recreational facilities.
- 3. The city's natural beauty contributes to its quality of life and provides opportunities for social interaction. Providing year-round recreational opportunities in these spaces will attract visitors and offer a means of enjoyment for residents. It is important to consider the city's natural resources when planning for the city's economic growth and development, and tourism potential.
- 4. All residents and visitors should have access to safe routes that connect recreational facilities, residential areas, and local attractions throughout the city. Consideration of public safety, accessibility and inclusivity will be taken into account when planning for recreational opportunities within the city.
- 5. The City has an opportunity to brand itself into a premier ecotourism/recreation destination due to its location on Lake Huron. The attraction of visitors to the city's coastal recreational amenities has the potential to create direct tourism-related jobs, but also to increase sales at local establishments (e.g. motels, cottage rentals, watercraft rentals, restaurants, resorts, grocery stores, gas stations, etc.).
