



## Two routes, one great trail.











## **Northern Lower Peninsula**

- ✓ Stay in scenic and forested areas where possible
- ✓ Connect to RRRA, Rose City, Ogemaw Hills Pathway, State Forest Land
- ✓ Connect to City of West Branch for amenities, lodging, Riverwalk and potential new snowmobile trail connection
- ✓ Rose City Road west of Rose City has widened shoulders
  all the way to the County line (about 11.5 mi.)



## **April Meeting**

### **AVOID:**

- Trail route along high speed roads (M55 or M33)
- Trail route along rural dirt roads where high speed vehicles/ORVs are a problem
- Disturbing Kirtland's Warbler habitat in NE portion of County
- Cons. Power Utility Corridor topo, wetland issues, \$1000/mi/year lease, need farmer's consent




## **April Meeting**

### **CONSIDERATIONS**

- ROW on Fairview Road is only 66 feet. May need easements of private property/State land.
- Minimize tree removal on State land
- Might be able to utilize two-track/snowmobile trails for trail route
- Powerline easements and pipeline xings



## **Cost Estimates for Ogemaw County**

- Ogemaw County: +/- 35 miles
- Est. approx. \$440,000/mile to design, engineer and construct
- 35 miles x \$440K = **\$15,400,000** (possibly cheaper if not paved)
- Also consider funding for regular operations and maintenance (est. budget of \$1,000/mi/year for regular and long-term maintenance).



## **Key Funding Source #1**



### **Iron Belle Trail Mini-Grants**

- Annual (this year was round 3) money from DNR general fund; any entity can apply
- Up to \$30,000
  - \* Engineering and design assistance
  - \* Construction project assistance
  - \* Purchase and installation of Iron Belle signs
- Suggested 5-10% match
- November 2017 application available; due early January 2018



## **Key Funding Source #2**





### Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund

- For land acquisition (no minimum request) or development (max \$300,000) of public recreation lands
- Only local units of government, school districts, or a local recreation authority with a <u>current</u>, <u>approved MDNR 5-Year</u> Recreation Plan on file may apply
- Minimum 25% match
- Due annually on April 1

## MDOT Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grants

- For <u>construction</u> of ped/bike facilities that are regional transportation connectors, and streetscape projects.
- Eligible applicant could be the County Road Commission, City, Village or DNR. MDOT may also partner with a local agency to apply for funding and implement the project.
- Ideal 35-40% match; reimbursement program
- Applications accepted year round



## **Other Funding Sources**



### For match \$:

- Local government funds (including adjacent communities)
- Cash, labor or material donations
- Grants that the MDNR can only apply for (Recreational Trails Program)
- Private foundations
  - i.e., DTE Energy, Consumers Energy, ITC \$1K to \$10K
  - Most will only award to a 501(c)3 non-profit (need to establish?)
- Consider creating an account with local Community Foundation to receive funds
- Local fundraising efforts



## Route Evaluation – Supporting Docs

### 2016 Ogemaw County Master Plan

- Cooperate with the MDNR to guide trail improvement and development within the county
- Consider development and linkage of no-mo pedestrian trails

### 2014 Ogemaw County Recreation Plan

- Create a trail system connecting State parks, local parks, public places and other community resources...
- Develop a walking pathway to promote outdoor exercise and benefits of non-motorized forms of locomotion and provide an opportunity to view wildlife and experience natural resources

### City of Rose City 2016 Rec Plan

- Promote...improvement of connected recreational opportunities
- Develop a system of non-mo paths within and outside the City

### City of West Branch 2014 Master Plan


 Market the City and the region to attract commercial and industrial enterprises; and to draw visitors and tourists to support local businesses and local economy
