Data Limitations: While tourism and recreation expenditures account for the majority of the sales in the businesses included in this table, they include an undetermined amount of sales to residents, as well. The sales and use tax owed by franchise corporations (e.g. Holiday Inns) are paid in a lump sum by the corporate headquarters. If franchise businesses do a significant share of the business in a given county, the sales and use tax data for that county underestimates the volume of this business activity. Businesses are classified by their principal business activity (e.g. hotel or restaurant). Many businesses, however, engage in a variety of sales activities. Thus the sales and use tax collections recorded under various classifications may not include the payments of all enterprises involved in some way in the type of business included in that category.
